# SEPTEMBER REFLECTIONS WITH JEAN BELL(CTD. FROM AUGUST)

Many hymns celebrate how an Omnipotent God, who has created the universe and all that is in it, can also care for us, understands our weaknesses and forgives our transgressions. One of my favourites, sung at my wedding 72 years ago is "Praise my soul the King of Heaven" which tells, 'Fatherlike he tends & spares us. Well, our feeble frame he knows. In his hands he gently bears us. Rescues us from all our foes.'

The powerful hymn "Amazing Grace" written by John Newton who was involved in the slave trade, tells how no-one is exempt from his redeeming love. One night when his ship was in a violent storm, he cried out to God for mercy and went on to become a Vicar. Some hymns directly ask God for his help, as in "Eternal Father strong to save." the hymn of fishermen.

Some hymns tell a story, especially Christmas Carols, such as, "Once in Royal David's City.", "While Shepherds watched their flocks by night.", "T'was on a Starry Night", the list is endless. "Good King Wenceslas" reminds us to care for others not as fortunate as ourselves, as God cares for us. Easter hymns too tell a story, "There is a green hill far away" which remind us of the great sacrifice Jesus made for us.

A favourite hymn of my mother's was, "What a friend we have in Jesus" In which we are told not to worry about things we cannot change, but to put our cares into the hands of Jesus. "Oh, what peace we often forfeit, oh what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry, everything to God in prayer." "Will your anchor hold" is another hymn where we are encouraged to trust God in times of stress and trouble, to keep a strong faith, just as an anchor keeps a ship safe in a storm.

Finally, we come to hymns of comfort when a loved one is no longer with us. Most songs of praise fulfil this purpose, but some are more specific than others. "The Lord is my Shepherd" is a reminder that God is with us all the way. "Thy rod & staff, they comfort me." "You lead me through green pastures" are lovely comforting images.

Now like Ted Hughes "Thought Fox" my pages are filled. I'm sure you would like to add your list of favourite hymns to mine!
